Senior citizens often face serious economic problems due to their inability to engage in regular income-generating activities, and they often experience neglect or discrimination within their families.

The changing dynamics of traditional family structures are exacerbating social insecurity and isolation among senior citizens. It is important for society to show love and cooperation towards them. This is where initiatives like "Vriddha Mitra" come into play. Providing essential services at the homes of the elderly is the highest form of service. Honourable Governor emphasized that such efforts are needed at every level. Elderly individuals in society require emotional, social, and psychological support as they navigate the challenges of their lives. Each hospital should have separate units for the elderly, and the need for independent ambulance services for them is crucial.

Organizations like SCHOOL should advocate for specific standards for the elderly with the governments at every level. The joint efforts of "Vriddha Mitra" and Pune Municipal Corporation have initiated the establishment of independent units for the elderly in two hospitals. Efforts are being made to introduce such units in other hospitals as well.

Honourable Governor felicitated the organizations and individuals associated with "Vriddha Mitra" initiative.

With a reach that began with 600 elderlies and has now reached 33,000 in Pune, Mumbai, Bhopal and Gwalior, Vriddha Mitra signifies a growing awareness of the crucial role in caring for our elderly population.
